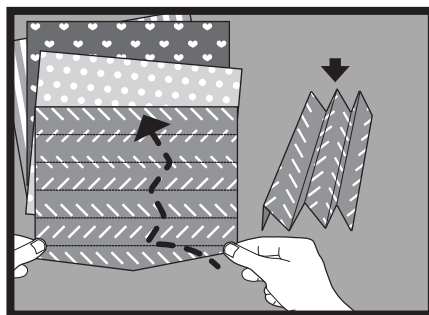
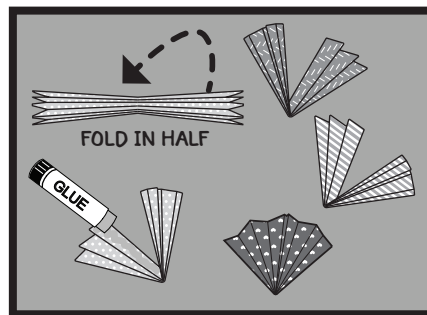


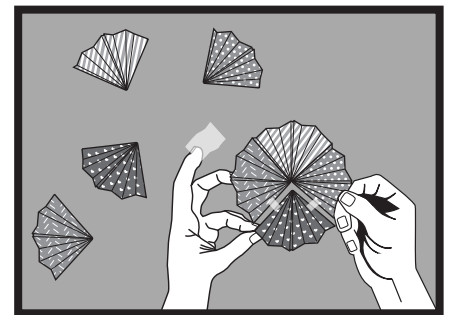
## INSTRUCTIONS



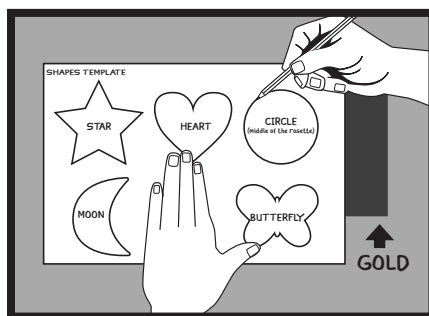
To start making your rosette you will need to fold your piece of paper in half, then fold it in half again and then once more you should have 8 folds in your paper. Now fold back and forth along the lines till you have zig zags.



Keeping the paper folded find the middle and fold in half to make a fan shape. Open the fan and glue down the inside edges. Stick the edges together and open out the folds to make a small fan.



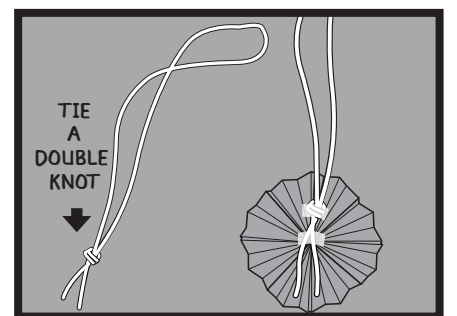
Place all 4 fans with the middles pointing in towards each other and the sides touching. Take a sticky tab and place one on one side of each fan (make sure that you put the tape on a side that doesn't join with another piece of tape when the fans are stuck together in a circle).



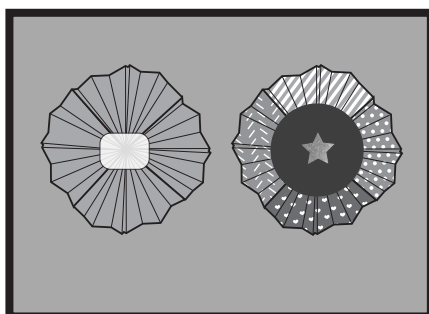
To decorate and finish your rosette, find the template that says 'middle of rosette'. Trace the shape onto a piece of the gold card by drawing around the shape with a pencil.



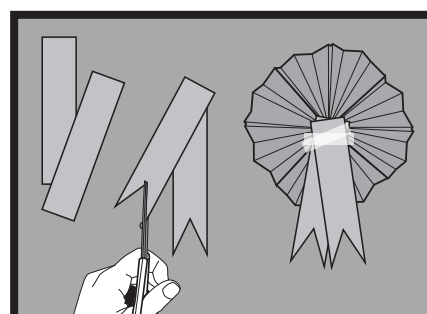
Take the template off the card and cut out your shape with some scissors. Using a piece of sticky tab attach the gold circle to the middle of the rosette.



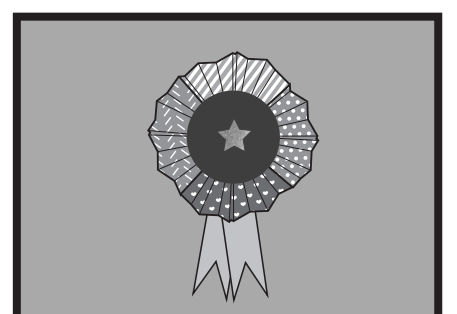
Pull the ends of your string together, tie a double knot so you have a circular piece of string and attach it to the back of your rosette with a small piece of sellotape.



If you want to wear your rosette like a medal - put one of your sticky pads on the back of the rosette, turn it around and stick it on your chest.



You can also make a 'tail' for your rosette. Cut two strips of metallic paper, cut a 'V' at one end. Attach them to the back of your rosette.



Well done! Can you think of other rosette tails you can make? You could try ribbon, strips of coloured paper? See what you can come up with.

## A PAPER CROWN...

**1.** To make your crown we are going to use the long piece of paper you have in your Art Kit

**2.** Use a piece of string or ribbon to measure the size of your head around your forehead then add 2 cm to the length for an overlap. This will be the size of your crown

**3.** Draw some diamond shapes on one side. Leave a straight piece on each end (overlap)

**4.** Use your left over foil or any patterned paper, cut it into shapes to decorate your crown

**5.** You could also use your paint, pens or paintsticks it is up to you - have fun!

**6.** Use your sticky tabs on one end of your crown at the back. Pull the other end round and stick it down onto the other side at the front

**7.** Well done! Now make some more for your friends using bits you have in the house

**WHAT YOU NEED TO MAKE YOUR PAPER CROWN**

Materials you will need:  
Sissors, paintsticks, paints, pens, glue stick, left over foil paper, sticky tabs or double sided tape.

## FUN FISH...

**1.** First carefully cut your bag along each side, open it out and lay it flat

**2.** Then draw some rectangles - see how many you can make. These will be the body of your fish

**3.** Cut out your rectangles - we will use one to start. You can make the others when you get the hang of it

**4.** With a marker, draw in a mouth, eyes and scales. Decorate your fish anyway you like. Be creative and enjoy!

**5.** Then on a piece of coloured or patterned paper - or you could also use any left over metallic paper, draw 2 x fins and 2 x tails and cut them out

**6.** Decorate your fins and tails, using a black marker round the edges and in the middle to give them definition

**7.** Turn your fins, tails and body over and stick the fins on either side of the body - near the eyes - and the tails at the opposite end. Put a sticky tab or double sided tape on top of the end of the tail

**8.** Now take the front of your body - from the underside - and gently bend it round to stick onto the tab you put at the tail

**WHAT YOU NEED TO MAKE YOUR FISH**

Materials you will need:  
Sissors, paintsticks, sticky tabs or double sided tape, paints, pens, glue stick, left over foil or paper.

## A BUTTERFLY...

**1.** To make your butterfly you will need a square piece of paper

**2.** Fold it in half score it well then open it up again and cut the square in half

**3.** Take the first half and fold in all the corners inwards scoring them down well

**4.** Start with the bottom edge and fold it up to about 1cm below the middle line

**5.** Keep folding backwards and forwards till all the paper on that side is folded to the middle

**6.** Turn it around and do the same on the other side

**7.** When you are done your paper should look like this

**8.** Holding it together fold it in half then tape it together at the centre line

**9.** Take the other half, turn it upright and fold it backwards and forwards all the way to the top

**10.** Holding it together fold it in half

**11.** Put the smaller folded piece on top of the longer one. Take a piece of string and tie them together in the middle. Work the knot so it is in the middle of the long piece facing upwards

**12.** Gently, making sure the knot is at the top start opening the folds you made. Spread the wings out on either side

**Well done! Try decorating your square before you start. Make a lot and hang them in your room!**
